Appendix 3: Co-ordinator's Annual Report for the 2024 AGM

Walk Programme: We revived the Stirchley walk but attendance was very poor with no walkers at all on a number of occasions. Stirchley has now been removed from the programme.

In conjunction with Madeley Town Council and Telford CVS we now have a weekly walk on Thursdays in Madeley. The 'bribe' of a free breakfast bap and hot drink for September meant the first walk attracted 24 walkers! Numbers have since dropped a bit but are still healthy.

A new walk at Admaston starts at the beginning of January 2025.

Walk Leaders: We currently have 37 active leaders or backmarkers registered with Ramblers and have welcomed a few new leaders this year; Dilys Fullerton, Caroline Freeman, Nicky Rothwell, Lorna Troon and Jade Meredith.

We still need more leaders. We need more committee members. We need a Coordinator and a Trainer. Without more volunteers it is difficult to see how we can extend the scheme, or in some cases maintain it.

It is a shame that we cannot encourage more walkers to lead, as quite often there are walkers that would be very good leaders, know their area well and turn up every week. Events:

We had joint stalls with Wellington Walkers are Welcome and T50 at Spring into St Georges, Wellington Midsummer Fayre, Wellington Green Day, Ironbridge Coracle Regatta plus more local ones in Leegomery, Admaston, St Georges and Donnington.

Statistics: Numbers are continuing to grow steadily on our walks, and we currently have 450 walkers registered on the Ramblers website, though they don't all still come on our walks.
